Participants will have a concrete plan to pilot and integrate their design thinking projects starting in the spring semester.

THE IMPACT

Educators were immersed in design thinking training through this collaborative learning experience.

16 faculty and staff members from across the KCKPS district were selected for the program—they were all sorted into 4 total Design teams.

To what extent have the following things changed as a result of your Startland experience(s)?


