Students are immersed in the entrepreneurial mindset, learn to network with peers, local entrepreneurs and organizations in their community, and create solutions to real-world problems during this 8week internship.

Students will have a viable solution at the end of the internship that can be pursued beyond the program.

This cohort was only open to women and gender minorities as we continue to combat systemic gaps and barriers, and push for an educational culture that inspires and empowers women.

THE IMPACT

Students were immersed in design thinking training through this collaborative learning experience.

15 students across 11 different schools were selected for this edition of the Social Change Internship.

Startland piloted a new evaluation tool in collaboration with the Urban Education Research Center for our programming this year. Below are results for our sixth cohort of Social Change Interns:


% of Students who Agree or Strongly Agree

Startand's Social Change Interns create projects to combat social inequalities across the bounds of race, gender, sexuality, mental health, income status and more.

> Read about the student projects from our most recent cohort of interns below:

Project: "Inclusivity Week"

Interns: Jamiah, Layla, Prisha, Sara

Addressing inequality between general and special education students, this team's goal is to create a week where students from both areas come together to enjoy different activities together-ranging from arts to sports.





Project: "Young People of Color and the KCPD" Interns: Nani, Jocelyn

Honing in on police brutality, this team suggests that an issue may be a lack of relationship between people of color and local departments. The interns pitched a 3session experience for young people of color and KCPD to foster deep relationships.

Project: "For Students, By Students" Interns: Aaliyah, Tyra, Suhani

Highlighting migrant student success rates and the need to support their acclimation to new homes (and, thus, schools), this team hopes to implement academic support and peer-to-peer learning in migrant educational services.





Project: "Comfort Packages" Interns: Al, Guadalupe, Iman

Fighting the stigma of people's menstrual cycles, this team created a discrete solution for students to grabn-go in the classroom. Unveiling the prototype during our showcase, the package features heating pads, snacks and motivational stickers.

Project: "Lead With Confidence" Interns: Jia. Miranda. Madison

Hoping to aid in making mental health a more regular conversation amongst students, the team's goal is to promote information around mental health through an Instagram account with information provided/vetted by licensed therapists.

Startland has graduated 94 students through our Social Change Internship. Interns often continue to pursue their solution once the program is over.

GirlsLeadKC
